October 1 – Depart the USA

Today, we depart from the USA to Tel Aviv, Israel. Meals served in flight.

October 2 – Arrive in Tel Aviv

Arrive at Ben Gurion International Airport in Tel Aviv and transfer to Pilgerhaus for a reception on the terrace.

October 3 – Nazareth Village, Akko, Zippori, Rosh Hanikra, Yardenit Baptismal Site

Explore the **Nazareth Village**, a living presentation of the life, times, and teachings of Jesus. Walk through the Crusader fortress of **Akko**. Visit **Zippori** with its 2,000-year-old ruins and mosaics. Travel to the northern most point of Israel on the Mediterranean coastline at Rosh Hanikra to view the caves formed by nature over thousands of years. At the **Yardenit Baptismal site**, situated where the Jordan River flows out of the Sea of Galilee on its south side, enjoy the peace and tranquility of the natural surroundings and participate in a baptismal service in the river in which Christ was baptized by John the Baptist.

October 4 – Gamla, Mount Hermon, Nimrod's Fortress, Caesarea Philippi, Katzrin, Golan Heights

Travel north to visit **Gamla**, known as the "Masada of the North," where Jews held out against the Roman armies in 67 AD, and where many perished when the Romans ultimately overran the almost impregnable fortress/city. Continue to the north of Israel and visit the highest mountain in the Holy Land, **Mount Hermon**. Visit **Nimrod's Fortress**, which graces the slopes of Israel's highest mountain. The fortress overlooks the forested dales and magnificent landscape of the area. Journey to **Caesarea Philippi**, where Peter proclaimed, "You are the Christ". Walk the streets of ancient **Katzrin** and see the remains of a 6th-century synagogue. You will also see why the **Golan Heights** are so important to the security of the nation of Israel.

October 5 – Megiddo, Caesarea Maritima - Aquaduct, Yom Kippur Eve

This morning, travel west to stop at **Megiddo** (biblical Armageddon), where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. Continue to the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to **Caesarea**, a center of the early Christians, where you will visit the Roman Aqueduct and Theatre. As you return to the Sea of Galilee and your hotel on the **eve of Yom Kippur**, reflect on the meaning of this holiest day.

October 6 – Yom Kippur Walking Tour, Mount of Beatitudes, Capernaum, Peter's Primacy

Today on Yom Kippur, we will enjoy a walking tour, starting with the peaceful **Mount of Beatitudes** overlooking the Sea of Galilee, the possible site where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. Visit **Capernaum**, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilee. Stand in the ruins of the synagogue built on the remains of the one where Jesus taught. See the other excavations, including

where Peter's house is thought to have been located. Stop at the **Chapel of the Primacy**, where Peter confessed his devotion to Christ three times.

October 7 – Chorazim, Magdala, Boat Ride, Fish Lunch, Ancient Boat, Beit Shean, Q'sar el Yahud, Samuel's Tomb, Mount Scopus, Jerusalem

We travel by motorcoach again today. Our first scheduled stop will be **Chorazim**, listed as a "city of woe" by Jesus. In **Magdala**, once home to Mary Magdalene, visit a recently discovered first-century synagogue. With Bible in hand, cross the waters of the **Sea of Galilee** by boat. Along the way, enjoy a special on-board worship service. Enjoy a **St. Peter's Fish lunch**. See the remains of a 2,000-year-old sailing vessel that was discovered and preserved at **Kibbutz Nof Ginosar**. This rare find is the type of boat which Jesus and the disciples would have used. We begin our journey south through the Jordan Valley to **Beit Shean**, one of the 10 Roman cities of the decapolis and also where the bodies of Saul and his sons were hung from the city walls after their defeat on Mount Gilboa. Later known as Scythopolis, the ruins of this once-opulent Roman city still impresses visitors with its city streets, marble sidewalks, Roman public baths, and theater. Enjoy a teaching at **Q'sar el Yahud**, possible location of the baptism of the Lord and crossing of the children of Israel into the promised land. Journey to the city of Jerusalem and **Samuel's Tomb**, home of Samuel the prophet. Finally, look out over the capital city of Jerusalem from **Mount Scopus**. Atop this strategic hill, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem stands where Roman Legions and Crusaders once camped. We can check into the hotel for dinner and a good night's sleep.

October 8 – Jacob's Well, Mount Gerizim, Samaria, Valley of the Shadow, Bethlehem - Shepherd's Field - Shepherd's Cave - Bethlehem Orphanage - Church of Nativity

This is an unusual day scheduled because of visiting ancient **Samaria**, where **Mount Gerizim** and **Jacob's Well** are located. This is where Jesus encountered the Samaritan woman. On our return to Jerusalem, you will visit the **Valley of the Shadow**, which is mentioned in David's writing of the 23rd Psalm. Enter Bethlehem and go to an area overlooking **Shepherds' Field**, where angels spread the Good News and a **cave**, reminiscent of the type used to house sheep, revered as **Jesus' birthplace**, located in the **Church of the Nativity**. We are spending some time at an **orphanage** in Bethlehem as well as a time shopping before returning to our Jerusalem hotel for dinner and overnight.

October 9 – Temple Mount, Nehemiah's Wall, Southern Steps, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam, Western Wall

See the **Temple Mount**, once the site of the Temple of Solomon. Next, you will visit a portion of **Nehemiah's Wall**, the wall that God instructed Nehemiah to build to protect the citizens of Jerusalem. We can walk on the 2,000-year-old **Southern Steps** that lead into the southern entrance of the temple platform compound. Many ancient Mikvahs are located at the foot of the steps. **Hezekiah's Tunnel** is located on the southern slope of Jerusalem - David's City - and provided access to water in the event of a siege of Jerusalem. Hezekiah's Tunnel was an amazing engineering feat that was dug from either end and met in the middle (Those who are claustrophobic may want to meet the group at the other end of the tunnel). In this same area, the **Pool of Siloam** was located, the site of the healing of the man born blind in John 9. Finally, visit the **Western Wall** and pray for the peace of Jerusalem.

This itinerary is subject to changes in sequence of days, local conditions, and preferences of the tour leader.

October 10 – Mount of Olives, Garden of Gethsemane, Pater Noster Church, Chapel of the Ascension, Antonia's Fortress

Stand on the **Mount of Olives** as Jesus did and enjoy a remarkable view of the "Golden City" of Jerusalem. Forty days after His resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven from the Mount of Olives. Walk down Palm Sunday Road to the **Garden of Gethsemane** and reflect on the events that took place in this area on the night before the crucifixion. It was in this area where Jesus went to pray after the Last Supper and was arrested. Visit the **Church of the Pater Noster**, standing next to the ruins of the 4th-century Byzantine Church of Eleona. Stop at the **Chapel of the Ascension** to remember the commission of Christ to His followers prior to His ascension into Heaven. **Antonia's Fortress** housed the Roman 10th legion and is one of the possible sites where the Lord stood trial with Pilate prior to the crucifixion. This evening is the **eve of Sukkot** when you will see sukkahs being constructed for this feast event.

October 11 – Pilgrim's Road, Caiaphas' House, Upper Room, Church of St. Anne, Pool of Bethesda, Sifting Project, Yad Vashem

Today is the first day of Sukkot. Recently uncovered, the **Pilgrim's Road** will allow you to walk the pavement leading up to the Temple Mount that hundreds of thousands of Jewish pilgrims traveled on Passover, Pentecost, and Sukkot. Beneath the **Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu**, you can walk through some of the ancient rooms of the house belonging to **Caiaphas the High Priest**. Many believe that Jesus was held overnight here before His crucifixion. Stand in the **Upper Room**, revered as the place of the Last Supper. Lift your voice in song in

the acoustically beautiful **Church of St. Anne**. View the **Pool of Bethesda**, where Jesus performed the Sabbath miracle. You will also have the opportunity to find ancient treasures from dirt taken from the Temple Mount at the **Sifting Project**. Explore the poignant exhibits of **Yad Vashem**, Israel's Holocaust Memorial. This evening, you can reflect on your day and enjoy a time of sharing.

October 12 – Masada, Sappir Park, Ein Gedi, Dead Sea, Qumran

Enjoy a visit to intriguing **Masada**, the spectacular mountaintop fortress built by Herod that later became the final tragic stronghold of the Jewish rebellion against the Romans in 73AD. Ride the cable car to the top to explore the fortress and look down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp below. Continue south to **Sappir Park** and see prophecy being fulfilled as stated in Isaiah 35. Journey to the oasis of **Ein Gedi**, where David and his men sought refuge from Saul. Stop at the shores of the **Dead Sea**, the lowest spot on earth, for an opportunity to take a quick dip in the mineral-laden waters. Visit **Qumran**, the site of the Dead Sea Scroll discovery, to learn about the mysterious community of the Essenes who once lived on the shores of the Dead Sea. Prepare for your return to the USA.

October 13 – Arrive in the United States

Arrive in the USA with a lifetime of memories to cherish.
